Students should research the program's reputation and look at rankings by reputable sources, such as U.S. News & World Report, to determine whether the program is recognized for its quality and excellence in theatre education.
- 5. ALUMNI SUCCESS AND OPPORTUNITIES** - The fifth factor to consider when choosing a college theatre program is the success of its alumni and the opportunities available to current students. Students should research the careers of alumni from the program and determine whether they have achieved success in their field. They should also look at the opportunities available to current students, such as internships, study abroad programs, and professional networking events, to determine whether the program can provide them with valuable connections and experience.
